7.Open Hearts To The Word

Mark 4:1-34

Openness to the Gospel varies greatly. It varies between people and it can vary over time. Sadly, both passive and active opposition to God and His ways is now natural to the fallen human race. It is only by the prompting of God's grace that we can open our hearts to God in active repentance and faith (Ephesians 2:4-10).

The background to today's passage is that opposition to Jesus had been growing. The Scribes and Pharisees had been in conflict with Jesus on five separate occasions (Mark 2:1-3:6) and were now saying that he was possessed by a higher demon (Mark 3:22). At this time even Jesus' own family thought He was crazy (3:20-21). While the crowds following Jesus were getting bigger (Mark 3:7-10 and 4:1), they were a very mixed and diverse group. Jesus was able to progressively explain much more to his regular disciples.

In Mark 4:1-34 Jesus explains His teaching and discipling strategy.

Q1.From the beginning many people flocked to hear Jesus (see Mark 1:28, 32-33, 37-39, 45; 2:1-2,13), but what indications are there that the crowds now were becoming massive and possibly even dangerous at this stage from Mark 3:7-10, 20-21; 4:1).
