8. Who Is This Guy?

Mark 4:35-41

The things Jesus has been doing since the commencement of his ministry has really got the people guessing just who He is. Mark has told his readers right at the beginning (Mark 1:1) just who he believes Jesus is. He is the Christ (The Coming One who would thoroughly save His people) and He is The Son of God (the Divine or God Man). Every incident in his Gospel gives evidence towards Mark' conclusion.

Jesus Himself resisted declaring that He was God at the beginning. He just lived and spoke in such a way that the people could increasingly tell.

This story is a classic clincher. This made the disciples' jaw drop. No man can change the weather. We are getting better at describing it and predicting it, but no mere mortal can definitively alter the weather. Jesus of Nazareth did in this incident. He commanded the wind and the waves and they were instantly stilled and made calm. Even the weather obeys this man.

Moses was able to part the waters of the Red Sea (Ex 14:19,21-31). The Lord told Moses what to do. "Lift up your staff ...". Moses was a man under orders from God. God did it through Him, but he never claimed to be God. Jesus just did from His own authority. God Himself was clearly living among us.
